Whole school listening project

We have all been focusing on listening over the last few weeks in school taking part in lots of games and activities to develop active listening skills. Some highlights have included

- reading the wonderfully creative writing that children produced after listening to pieces of music
- an assembly guessing the animals for each piece of music in Saint-Saens' 'Carnival of the Animals'
- every class talking about how important it is to listen to each other to support well-being and mental health and
- listening to the different voices of grandparents, uncles and aunts reading stories in class



It was great to see so many parents at the 'Listening to your child' workshop and that it received such positive feedback. If you couldn't make it the handouts are available from the office and we will try to run this workshop again in future years.

Class teachers nominated children who really responded to our Listening Project to receive an audio book to take home: well done to Rachel (Rec), Ana (Y1), Lily (Y2), Jesse (Y3), Nicolas (Y4), Zachary (Y5) and Christina (Y6) for their super listening skills!

Thank you and Christmas charity

Thank you to all parents and families who contributed to our recent charity collections. We raised £90 for the British Legion with our Poppy Appeal and we collected an amazing 130 Christmas Boxes for Samaritan's Purse which will be delivered to a child somewhere in the world living in very different circumstances who would not otherwise receive a gift.

School council have held a discussion and vote among the classes to decide upon our Christmas Charity and have decided we will split the money raised three ways between Cancer Research UK, Save the Children and a charity to support an ill child in Armenia (a charity suggested by Aleksandra in Y4). We will collect money for our Christmas Charity at the Nativity on Thursday 7th December, at the carol singing in Hampstead on Thursday 14th (please note changed date) and on our Christmas Jumper Day on Wednesday 13th.
