We would like you and the Government to

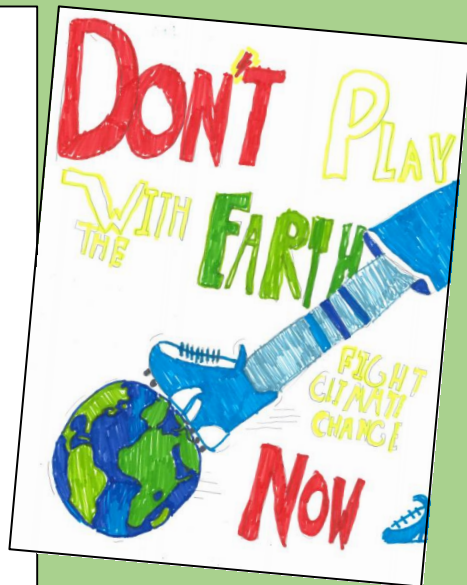
- Stop using money to cut down trees and plants
