Dear parents and carers,

The preparations for our very exciting whole school production of 'Joseph and his technicolour dreamcoat' are well under way. Mr Pegden has begun teaching all of the songs (I can imagine parents are hearing some of them at home already!), we are beginning to rehearse the acting parts and each class will shortly start rehearsing their dances. This week I have also been telling the Biblical story of Joseph in assemblies so that we all understand the story and where it comes from.

All staff members are part of one of several teams leading on the organisation of different parts of the preparations – please read the messages and appeals for help from parents from each of these teams below. This production is a big undertaking for the school, costing far more than one of our usual arts projects, and is primarily funded from our Arts Project reserves, all of which has been previously donated by the Friends Association. We will be asking for parental help for specific tasks and for parents to donate towards elements of the project – please do help us if and when you can. I know that all the preparation and rehearsal will be well worth it to create an experience on stage for all the children that they will never forget! And hopefully an unforgettable experience for the audience, too!

**Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> March at 2pm** (all children should be able to be collected at 3.20 as usual, or just a bit late)


