Making a difference

Dear parents and carers,

As we come back to school for the last half term of the year, each class will begin thinking about and working on a project where they can make a difference to others. Children will be learning about why there is deprivation, disadvantage and exploitation locally and globally and trying to make a difference in lots of different ways.

- Reception will be learning about the role of UN Peace Keepers and how to be peace keepers in our playground;
- Year 1 will be fundraising for a school in Zambia, where conditions are very different from here at Christ Church;
- Year 2 will be learning about education around the world and fundraising for a UNICEF 'school in a box';
- Year 3 will be learning about the work of Christian Aid and running a project linked to Christian Aid week;
- Year 4 will be writing letters about reducing plastic in our environment and presenting these to our local MP;
- Year 5 will be learning about the persecution of different groups and presenting letters to our MP about the disadvantages found by asylum seekers and refugees in this country;
- Year 6 will be learning about sustainable ways to purify and filter water and running their own businesses to raise money for WaterAid.

These are all great projects and causes, many chosen by the children themselves. Last term we focused on explaining and understanding our school vision of 'inspiring *life in all its fullness*' for all in our school community; this term we want to look beyond this, thinking about *life in all its fullness* for all, to see how we can support others locally and globally who do not have the same opportunities as us. We want to teach children to learn and think about others and to empower them to know that, even if they start in a small way, they can make a big difference in our world. Please look out for information about your child's class project and how you can get involved - thank you in advance for your support.

## Soccer Aid – Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June

On Friday 7<sup>th</sup> June the whole school will be taking part in the UNICEF Soccer Aid challenge. UNICEF's theme this year is fundraising so that every child has the opportunity to play. Article 31 of the UNCRC states that 'every child has the right to relax and play' and UNICEF is highlighting that play is as essential to a child's development as nutrition, healthcare and protections from danger.

We would love to raise £375 to pay for a community playground in Zambia so that 100 children can play safely. If we could exceed this target we could also pay for a 'pre-school in a box' full of toys, games

and books for children in a refugee camp (an extra £172) or antibiotics for 125 children suffering from pneumonia (an extra £50).

School council will be setting up a fun football obstacle course in our playground and, through the course of the day, all our classes will be taking part. All parents are warmly invited to join us in the junior playground from 2.45pm to watch the winners and staff take part and to have a go themselves – for a donation towards UNICEF! Please come and have a go!

Each child can wear their Happiness T-shirt and/or PE kit all day and we are encouraging everyone to bring a donation of at least £2 in exchange for having a go at the obstacle course. Please help us raise lots of money for this great cause!

## PSHE week – the wider community

In this term's PSHE week (10<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> June) we will be learning about living in the wider community. Classes will be learning about charities, careers, volunteering, democracy and money. The week will include visits from Tulip Siddiq MP and volunteers from Heath Hands and the Royal Free Hospital, and trips to MetroBank, Barclays, and to the Heath Education Centre to plant bulbs and to Henderson Court Age UK centre to sing and take part in craft activities with the elderly people. Our careers morning also takes place in this week with over 25 people coming to talk about their jobs with our Year 5 and 6 classes and the Year 6 class from another local school. It promises to be another very busy and interesting PSHE week!

## Our Christian Values

In the Spring term we introduced our reviewed school vision and Christian values to the children. Our chosen Christian values are compassion, simplicity, courage, community and creativity, with each one rooted in a Biblical text or story and then related to children's own lives and how we act. Over the next five months we will introduce these values, one at a time, to parents in the newsletter, too.



**Community** This value is rooted in the Bible passage in 1 Corinthians 12: 12-26. *'A person's body is one thing, but it has many parts. Yes, there are many parts to a body, but all those parts make only one body. Christ is like that too. If the whole body were an eye, the body would not be able to hear. If the whole body were an ear, the body would not be able to smell*

*anything. If each part of the body were the same part, there would be no body. But truly God put the parts in the body as he wanted them. He made a place for each one of them. And so there are many parts, but only one body. The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the foot, "I don't need you!" And those parts of the body which seem to be weaker are really very important. If one part of the body suffers, then all the other parts suffer with it. Or if one part of our body is honoured and praised, then all the other parts share in its honour and praise.'*

We have been thinking about how, like each important and different part of our body, each one of us is unique and wonderful and has an important part to play in our community. We have been linking this value to our own lives by reflecting that:

- ❖ Community is everybody working towards the same vision and goals.
- ❖ Community is when we celebrate and have fun together!
- ❖ Community is when we support each other when times are tough. We are stronger together.
- ❖ Community is working together to achieve amazing things.
- ❖ Community is making sure everyone plays an important part and that their voice is heard.
- ❖ Community is belonging to something bigger, which helps us to find meaning and happiness.
- ❖ Community is each of us taking responsibility and caring for our school, our local area and our world.
