Explanations/Hints and tips

Week 1

Prefix: un-. This prefix is usually used to give words a negative meaning.

Week 2

Prefix: mis-. This prefix is usually used to give words a negative meaning.

For some of these words there is a frequently-used root word with the opposite meaning, for others there is not.

Week 3

Prefix: dis-. This prefix is usually used to give words a negative meaning.

Week 4

Prefix: re- meaning 'again' or 'back' and **sub-** meaning 'under'

Week 5

Prefixes: super- meaning 'above.' **anti-** meaning 'against.' **auto-** meaning 'self' or 'own.'

Week 6

Prefix: in-. This prefix can mean both 'not' and 'in/into', in the words given here it means 'not'.
