## Christmas charities

School council, which includes representatives from all classes, have chosen our Christmas charities and they have decided to continue to support the same three organisations as last year. We will be supporting World Vision, a Christian charity who support vulnerable children around the world, Toilet Twinning, to raise money for clean hygienic toilets and Great Ormond Street Hospital, where some of our children and families have recently been supported.

We raise money with collections at our Nativity Play, KS2 carol singing in Hampstead and on our Christmas Jumper Day. Please give generously – they are all wonderful causes to support.



## Punctuality and the beginning of the day

It is getting very congested, particularly in the hall, at the beginning of the school day and the lines in the playground are looking very empty as children are arriving later to school and joining their classes from all directions– *please read the following information carefully and help us all to have a punctual and orderly start to the school day. Thank you!*

- Children should be in the playground ready to line up when the bell rings at 8.50am. Learning and the school day starts straight away at 8.50am – children are missing learning time as well as disrupting other children and staff if they arrive late.
- Children and parents should not be in school before the bell rings (unless it's raining or parents have a query for the school office). Please stay outside in the playgrounds.
- Juniors should enter the junior playground via Christ Church Passage and down the junior steps. Infants should enter through the infant gate on Christchurch Hill. If you have children in both playgrounds, please move between the playgrounds by the passageway between the playgrounds, not via the hall. (The only exception to this is parents with push chairs – please use the hall if you need to but it really helps if you let the children in and up to their classrooms first).
- Junior children should make sure they are in the junior playground on time to join their class line, rather than entering through the hall, please.
- Parents, please don't come into school with your child (infant parents are great at saying good bye in the playground but there are more and more Year 3 and 4 parents in the hall each day at the moment). Once the bell has gone, junior parents please say good bye to your child and then leave the playground by the junior steps or round the passageway to the infant gate.
- Only parents who have a query for the school office should be in the school building at the beginning of the day, please.

It has been very hard to access the school while Christchurch Passage has been closed over the past several months but having this access open will be a great help to many families. Please make every effort to be on time so that children are ready to start the day at 8.50am.

As the weather gets wetter and colder and the leaves continue to fall, please take extra care on the steps and around the school site.

## **School meals feedback and next steps**

The Year 6 school council representatives and Mrs Forsdyke recently met with the Operations Manager from Caterlink and the Camden school meals monitoring officer to give children, staff and parent feedback about school meals. School councillors set out their concerns about portion size, variety for vegetarians and choice for the last classes to be served, as well as lots of positive feedback from the surveys they carried out in every class. Recent parent feedback was also passed on to Caterlink and Camden's monitoring team. There was lots of useful and interesting discussion about

- how the school meals are decided upon following the School Food Standards and the Camden enhanced food standards;
- how each whole meal (main course and pudding) is nutritionally analysed to make sure it is healthy and includes the right elements, e.g. 60g protein per meal;
- recent training for our school cooks which has helped quality improve and them to achieve very highly on the regular monitoring visits;
- how everyone is trying to limit food waste and how children, the cooks and the school can help to reduce this.

Some next steps were decided as a result of the meeting (and school council will talk about these with the school in an assembly):

- ongoing monitoring of portion sizes by Caterlink to ensure these are correct, alongside ongoing and regular monitoring of quality of food;
- trialling a meat-free Monday for the spring term where there will be two vegetarian (and no meat) options – lots of Camden schools are already trying this;
- cooking a few more vegetarian portions and more vegetables to ensure there is enough for everyone, but at the same time trying to limit waste. There should be unlimited salad and vegetables for everyone.
- expanding the selections of salads that are available;
- Caterlink took away lots of the children's suggestions about meals (e.g. soups) to think about whether they can be incorporated in the menus in the future;
- Caterlink will communicate again with the delivery companies to ensure deliveries take place as planned – this is often the reason why, on occasion, something different from the published menu is served.

The adults at the meeting were very impressed with the children's comments and thanked all the children and parents for the very useful feedback.

## **Design and technology (DT) projects**

We hope you enjoyed finding and buying your child's Christmas item at the Christmas Fair. This year we linked these items to our Design and Technology curriculum and children put in a lot of effort to research, design, make and evaluate the items to sell.

Our DT work included:

- mood boards of research and then taste-testing of the gingerbread made by Year 5;
- detailed evaluation of a first attempt at the decorations and puppets made by Years 1 and 6 and then creation of much-improved second versions to sell;
- moving mechanisms built into the Christmas cards and toys created by Years 2 and 3;
- prototypes of biscuit boxes created and tested for strength by Year 4;
- mixing of salt dough to create decorations in Reception.

You never knew so much thought went into the items you bought at the Fair!



## **Healthy schools – Gold!**


