

Year 3 visited the Samsung Technology Centre at the **British Museum**. We examined the processes involved in Ancient Egyptian mummification and their afterlife beliefs. We looked at lots of primary sources and discussed what their importance might have been. We were also able to create our own Egyptian tomb art considering what is important to us now and comparing this to Ancient Egyptian times.



History trips – Autumn term 2019



Year 2 visited the **Florence Nightingale Museum** at Saint Thomas' Hospital. While there, we were able to ask and answer questions with an actor pretending to be Florence Nightingale. We were also able to look around the museum, observing different artefacts and discussing why and how things were done, and how Florence changed things for the better at Scutari Hospital, and then later in her life back in England and beyond.



This term **Year 5** visited the **Museum of London** to support our learning about Anglo-Saxon Britain. The exhibition explained how the Anglo-Saxons invaded and settled in the area now known as London. We studied primary sources such as brooches, weapons and pottery that archaeologists have discovered. From these sources we were able to determine who and what the people were like that lived around London in 500AD. We were also very fortunate to listen to an Anglo-Saxon story teller known as a "Scop" who re-told ancient stories including the poem Beowulf.
