Explanations/Hints and tips

General Suffix Rules:

If the root word ends with a consonant, the relevant suffix can be added straight on. However, if the root word ends with a consonant which has a vowel directly before it, then the consonant is doubled before the suffix is added (e.g. plod - plodding, forgot - forgotten, travel - traveler). The final thing to remember is that if the root word ends with an e, the e is removed before the relevant suffix is added.

Suffixes -ing and -en See the general suffix rules for guidance when adding the suffix -ing and the suffix -en

Suffixes -er and -ion/-ation See the general suffix rules for guidance when adding the suffix -er and suffix - ion. Also, if the root word ends in a 'y' it changes to and 'i' before the suffix is added (tidy - tidier, muddy - muddier - these usually make comparatives)

Suffix: The suffix -ly is added to an adjective to form an adverb - the rules already learnt about suffixes still apply. However, the suffix -ly starts with a consonant letter, so it is added straight on to most root words e.g. finally (final + ly), comically (comical + ly) and usually (usual + ly). Finally, if the adjective ends with a 'y', it is usually changed to an 'i' before the -ly is added (happy - happily).
