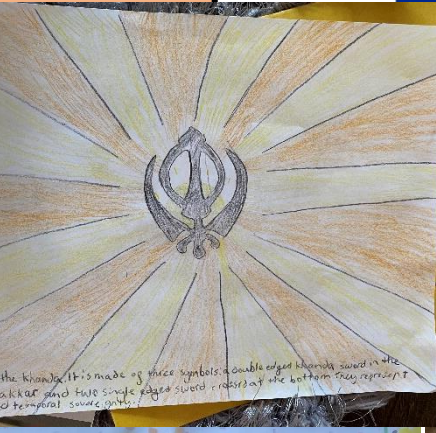

I have used the Khanda because it is the first sacred Sikh holy book.

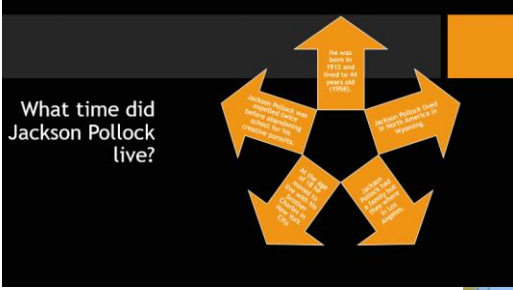
I have used the Khanda because it shows some of the Gias. For example it shows the Kirpan which is a sword that you use only to protect people.
