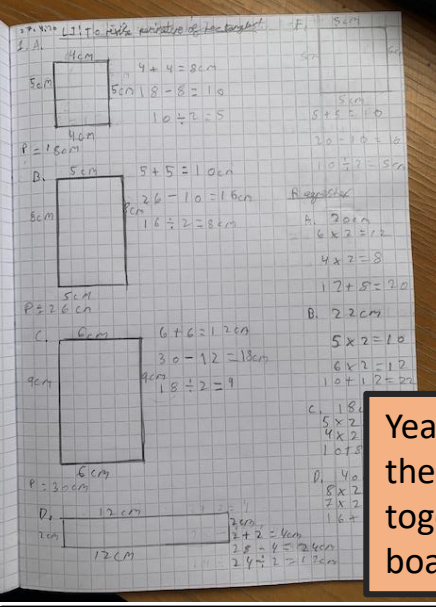
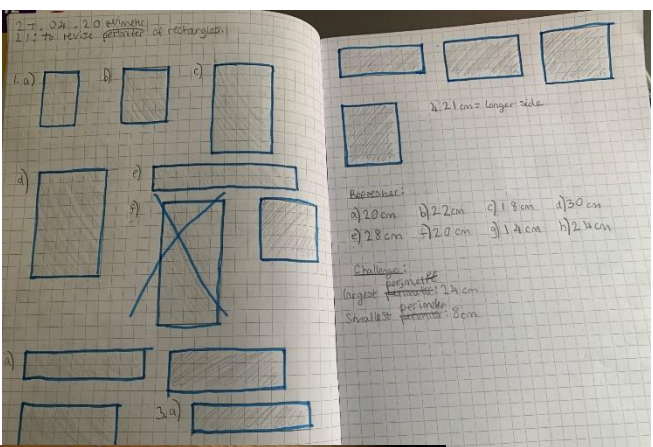


In maths year 5 began the Summer term by revising Perimeter.

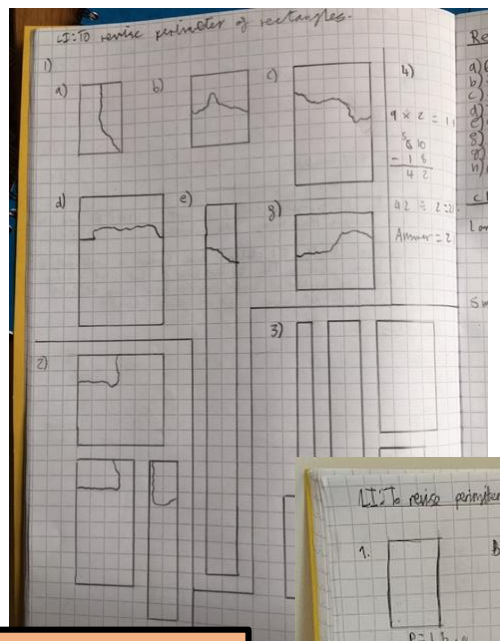


They needed to find the perimeters of rectangles but they were only given parts of the shapes so they needed to work out the lengths of each side first.

Year 5 needed to remember that to find the perimeter of a shape you add together the different lengths of the borders.

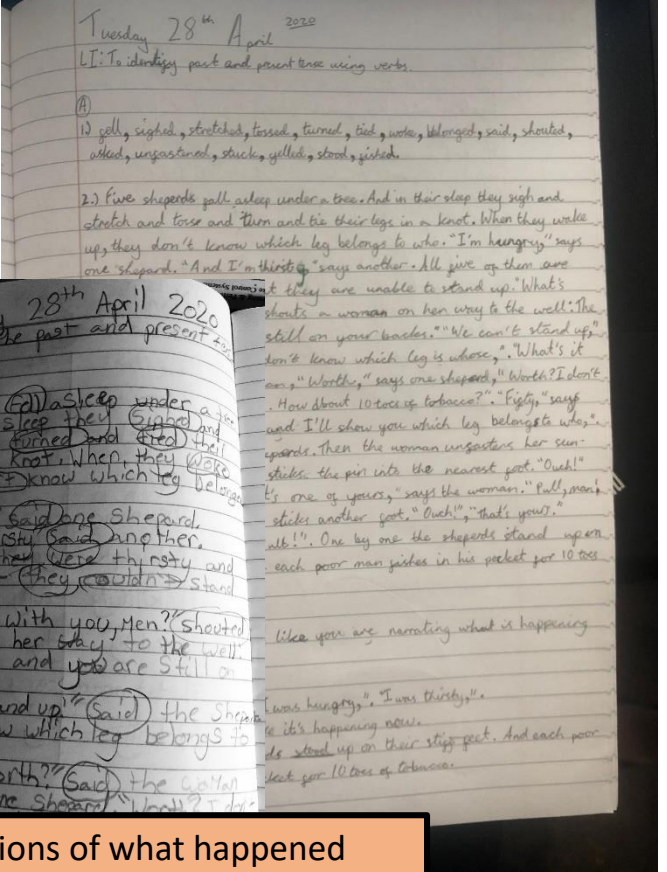
Year 5 Summer Term Day 1- 2
