- Don't open messages from people that you don't know. These could be nasty, contain viruses or be trying to sell.

Keeping Safe Online

Too much time on the internet or games or social media will release stress and anxiety.

There are lots of rules for children, but also adults and teenagers, to stay safe online. Some of which are:

- Keep personal information to yourself and limited.
- Check strong passwords.
- Make sure your internet connection is secure.
- Be careful what you post and if it's something rude about someone else.

Don't meet up with anyone you met online. It could be a trap.
