

My dearest friends, today this bloody War has come to an end. Hostilities will officially end at one-minute past midnight tonight. We have suppressed tyranny in every way possible and today is Victory in Europe! It is our Nation's victory. Let us rejoice and have peace between other Nations once more!

Our Nation has remained in good hands with our industrious women replacing our dauntless men at war in the factories and the fields. Let us remember our fearless soldiers and our loyal allies, fighting beside us. This day will be known as VE Day. The horrific, horrendous, hideous war over and we deserve to celebrate.

Unfortunately, we will have to ration our supplies for some time to come, but I strongly believe that we will get back to full health in no time. We will build our cities taller, stronger, bigger than before. We will plough our fields and expand our factories and rebuild

Tuesday 8th May, V.E. Day

At last the war is over!! It has been on ever since I left school! Up early and went out shopping with Mum. Queued for fish. Put up flags. Toasted victory in homemade cider. At 12:00 George and I went to Church to a Thanksgiving Service. After dinner went for a walk, up Hollow and along Miss James' Walk. Flags everywhere – many upside down. After tea, cut out and tacked a skirt. Went down to bonfire at Border Road at 10:00 p.m. It went up with a beautiful blaze. Firework display and singing round an old piano till midnight.
