I know that we all really hope we can get back to normal by September, but I am awaiting the latest updated guidance from the government about how schools can operate, before I can confirm our plans.



Cooking classes with Miss Willmer!

A message from Miss Willmer:

I had the pleasure of teaching at Christ Church School in Reception and Year 1 but left in 2016 when I had my second son. I hope you're all well!

Since then, I've moved to Devon, had another little one and started Time to Cook: online cookery classes for children. I run these classes with my mum,

Rosemary, who is an amazing cook and keen gardener! We run two online Clubs, the Time to Cook Club for children aged 2-6 years and the Time to Cook Club Juniors for children aged 7 years and upwards! We're also starting the Time to Cook Academy for adults in August!

Entry to the Club works on a calendar basis but you only need to sign up a month at a time. It costs £10 a month and you'll get access to a private members' area of our website. Two new recipes and two online class videos will get uploaded every week. The videos will be pre-recorded so you'll be able to enjoy them whenever you're free and to watch them as many times as you like! We post the ingredients lists in advance so you'll have plenty of time to source them!

We'll also give you access to a private Time to Cook Facebook group where you can post pictures of your child's bakes, ask any questions and meet parents with similar baking interests!

School policies

These school policies have recently been reviewed by staff and governors:

- Relationships Education, including a Statement on our provision for Sex Education

Our Relationships Education Policy sets out our teaching for the new statutory relationships education which was due to become statutory in September, but has now been delayed until later in the year. The policy is based on the model developed by schools across Camden and also sets out our provision for Sex Education. As usual, we will invite parents to come to a parent workshop about this policy, our teaching in this area and how you can support this at home, before we teach any of this content.
