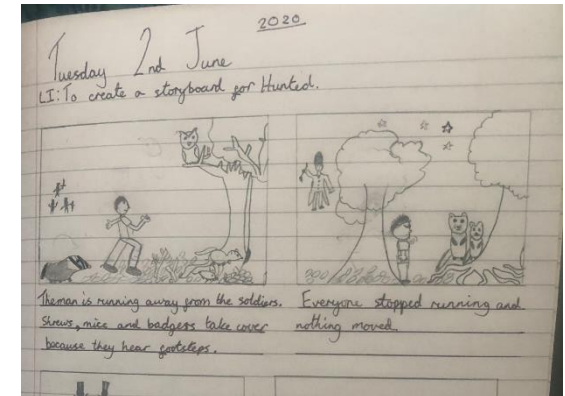
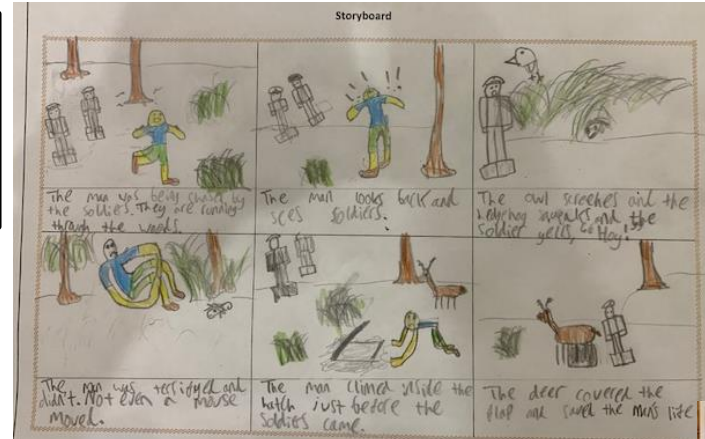


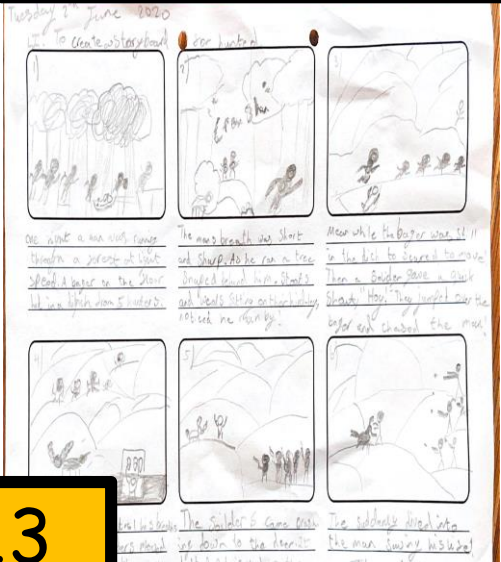
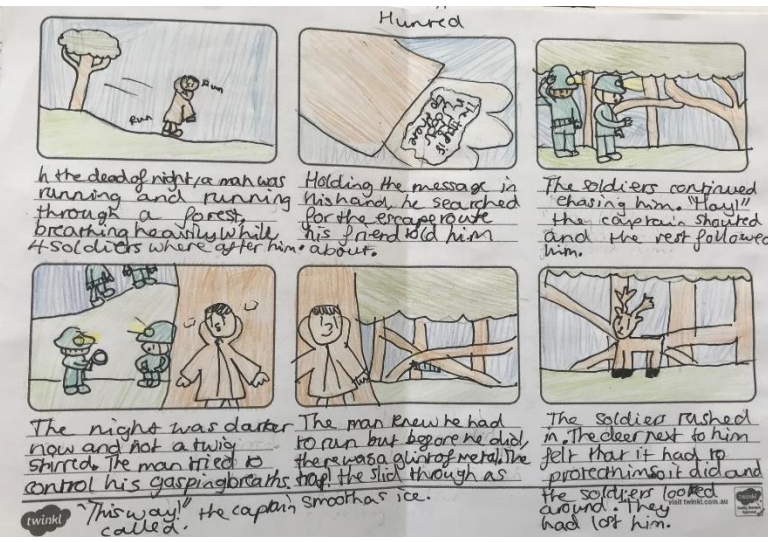
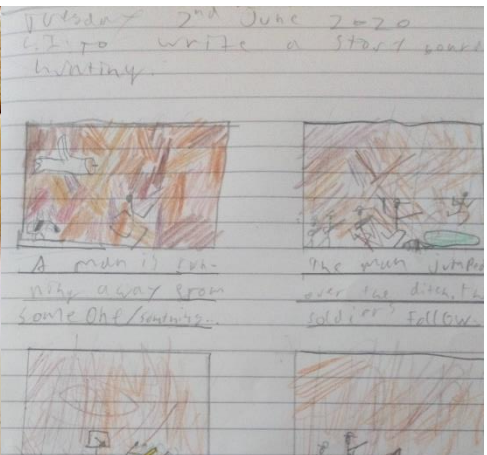
This is our first week back after half term and Year 5 been very busy.
