Explanations/Hints and tips

Week 1

Prefixes - The rules of using the prefix in- when it changes to il- and ir-. In these words, the prefix means 'not'. The rule taught here is when a root word begins with an l or a r, in- becomes il- and ir-respectively. Remember there will now be double l or double r.

Week 3

Prefixes - The rules of using the prefix in- when it changes to im-. In these words, it continues to mean 'not'. The rule taught here is when a root word begins with an m or a p, in- becomes im-.

Week 4

Prefix: inter- meaning 'between' or 'among'

Week 5

Words ending with the /g/ sound spelt -gue (French in origin) Words ending with the /k/ sound spelt -que (French in origin)
