Keeping everyone safe in school

Like all schools, we have adapted our routines to keep everyone safe in school, including introducing regular hand washing, enhanced cleaning and staggered break and lunch times to keep classes as separate as we can. Although we're not able to hold any mixed class activities at the moment, it was lovely for the whole school to join together virtually to share our golden certificates at the end of last week via a zoom assembly viewed in each classroom. Well done to all the children who have been amazing at settling in to the new routines!

Parents have also been wonderfully supportive of the school with the many changes over the past six months. The children's progress at home over the period of home learning, the return to school for so many children in June and July and the smooth start to the new school year last week would not have happened without our usual brilliant support from the parent community. Thank you.

Parents can continue to help us by

- **Keeping your child at home if your child or anyone in your household has any symptoms of COVID-19.** If this happens, please inform the school and arrange a test. Do not send your child to school if they have a high temperature, a new continuous cough or if there has been a change in their sense of taste or smell. (If your child develops a temperature or cough in school, we will phone you to ask you to collect them and arrange a test.)
- **Being on time at the beginning and end of the day (not early) and leaving as soon as you have dropped off or picked up your child.** We are all getting used to the adjusted start and finish times over these first few weeks, and, of course, teachers are getting to know and recognise parents of children in their new classes. We know the dismissal will take a few minutes so please be patient and wait at a distance from others in the playground or in Christ Church Passage. In the juniors, if you would like to speak to the

class teacher or if you are picking up different children than usual, you are very welcome to come down into the playground to talk to staff members.

- **Letting us know if your child is not in school for any reason** Please email if possible – then we will not chase you up to find out where they are.
