
#### PE

<u>Trips</u> It looks unlikely that we will be able to conduct any trips this term. However, where possible, we will try to invite visitors and workshops into school and conduct local visits if they are relevant and can be done safely. Information about any trips outside school will be sent to parents separately.

<u>Homework</u> - We will not be setting homework tasks in the first half term of this academic year while we take stock and review how our homework works. Children should still be reading regularly at home and we will still be sending home spellings and times tables to learn and practise each week, as well as information about the learning which has taken place in school that week.

After half term, homework will be sent home on Thursdays and is due back the following Tuesday.

Spellings will be sent home on Thursday and tested on Tuesday. Times tables will be tested on Tuesday later in the term. Please check weekly homework sheet for details.

The reading diaries will continue to be used in order to carefully monitor progress in reading as well as being a useful home-school link. In Year 2 reading may move towards group reading to develop new reading strategies.

#### Christ Church Arts Project and the Global Sustainable Development Goals

As parents will know, Christ Church is an active Rights Respecting School and we regularly seek to promote the rights of all children in everything we do. For this term's Arts Project we are taking the opportunity for classes to explore the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child and, in particular, the Global Goals for Sustainable Development. With help from the class teachers, the children will select one of the 17 Global Goals, as well as one of the articles in the Convention, and produce artwork to promote them. Some of these Global Goals include gender equality, good health, renewable energy and

climate action. In our Reception class, the children will be introduced to the UNICEF symbol as they start their Rights Respecting journey through our school. We are looking forward to sharing our art work with parents in some way later in the term. https://www.globalgoals.org/



#### English



English will be taught through the topics of Stories in familiar settings, Letters and postcards, and Poetry based on a particular poet. We will work on a range of spelling, punctuation, grammar and reading skills through learning related to these genres. We will also recap Phase 5 phonics and move towards spelling and arammar.

#### Maths



We will be covering a range of topics:

- Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Measures
- Multiplication and division

Shape and Data

We will also start weekly times tables tests later in the term.

# Computing



This term we will focus on algorithms and coding using BeeBots and RodoCodo. We will also publish postcards when we are learning about them in English lessons.



Why is it good to listen to and remember the stories Jesus told? - Key focus will be on the parables Jesus taught us and what they can teach Christians. Why are Saints important to Christians? - We will learn about what Saints are, who some of them are, what some key characteristics of Saints might be, and how we can be more saintly in our lives.

Where is the Light of Christmas? - Our Christmas unit will focus on the light of Christmas, and Jesus as the light of the world. Children will also write recounts and do artwork linked to Christmas and the Nativity story.

#### History



Florence Nightingale - We will think about why Florence is a significant historical figure, think about how we can learn about her achievements, and consider how she changed nursing for the better (looking at things we still do even now).

Great Fire of London - We will look at different historical sources and what we can learn from them. We will also consider lasting changes that were made due to the fire.

### Geography



Are places different around the world? - We will name and locate the seven continents, five oceans and study human and physical characteristics of the United Kingdom. We will also compare the UK to a contrasting location (Australia) and think about similarities and differences between them.

#### **PSHF**





Our PSHE week takes place during the week commencing Monday 9th November 2020 and will focus on positive relationships (including anti-bullying) and celebrating diversity. In Year 2 we will learn about ourselves and others, celebrating differences, and how things we do have an effect on other people.

## PΕ



Athletics - mastering basic movements such as running, jumping, throwing and catching, kicking and striking, as well as developing balance, agility and coordination. They will begin to apply these in a range of activities and cooperative games, developing simple tactics for attacking and defending.

# Music

Unfortunately, music is a curriculum area which will be constrained by current guidelines in combination with the physical size and space available to us in school. Any group singing and playing of certain instruments (including the recorder) will not be able to take place. Instead, we will aim to explore music, composers and musical notation at an age-appropriate level. We hope that our wonderful music curriculum will resume very soon, when it is safe to do so.

#### Art



This year we will be developing our art and design skills through a range of projects such as Great Fire of London printing (developing knowledge of colour mixing, using relief printmaking materials and processes to communicate ideas, developing existing skills in drawing and mark making to explore shape, form and texture), and Nativity scenes (trying out a range of marks on different surfaces using different media with the focus on tone (lightness/darkness), using famous art works as inspiration for our own work and begin to explain how we have been

#### Design Technology

Levers and sliders - we will create Christmas cards, looking at how levers and sliders can be used to create moving mechanisms.
