Migration is when people move to live in different places.

- There are many types of migration:
  - National migration (when the migrants move to a different place in the country)
  - International migration (when the migrants move to a different country)
  - Temporary migration (when the migrant intends on going back to their original place)
  - Permanent migration (when the migrant does not intend on moving back to their original place)
  - Forced migration (when the migrant has to move to another place)
  - Voluntary migration (when the migrant wants to move to another place)

- There is an emergency

INTERNATIONAL MIGRATION-WHEN SOMEONE TRAVELS FROM COUNTRY TO COUNTRY.

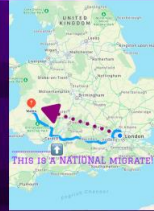
FORCED MIGRATION-WHEN SOMEONE IS FORCED OUT OF THEIR COUNTRY BECAUSE OF A WAR OR NATURAL DISASTERS.

VOLUNTARY MIGRATION-WHEN SOMEONE DECIDES TO MOVE COUNTRY AND THEY HAVE THE OPTION TO.

PERMANENT MIGRATION-WHEN SOMEONE DECIDES TO MOVE COUNTRY AND STAY THERE FOR A LONG TIME.

TEMPORARY MIGRATION-WHEN SOMEONE MOVES TO ANOTHER COUNTRY BUT STAYS THERE FOR A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME.

## Migration

What is Migration: Migration is the movement of People from one place to another place.

There is four types of Migration:

- Internal migration: moving within a state, country, or continent.
- external migration: moving to a different state, country, or continent.
- emigration: leaving one country to move to another.
- immigration: moving into a new country.

According to a recent report more people stay within the country of birth, and decide to migrate within countries. This is called National Migration. Although in 2019, there were around 272 million international migrants in the world, mostly in Europe and Asia.

When they reach their destination they often face difficulties in accessing health care, housing, education or employment. They may become easy targets for abuse, extortion and exploitation due to a lack of a protective family network, a lack of information or missing documents.

Reasons for Migration:

- Poor living conditions generate the urge to migrate
- The population grows while economic development stagnates.
- Violence and the abuse of power force people to flee.
- The rich industrialized states are becoming more accessible.



### What is Migration?

Migration is when someone moves from their home, usually due to war in their home country. Although, most people move through their country, not leaving it.



Many people migrate each year, although most of the world's population don't.

Forced Migration: when someone is forced to leave somewhere.

Voluntary Migration: when someone chooses to leave somewhere.

Permanent Migration: when someone leaves somewhere and doesn't intend to return.

Temporary Migration: when someone leaves somewhere and does intend to return.

# Migration



Migration is when people move from one country to another. There are 6 types of Migration. They are:

- National-When you migrate to a different part of a country
- International-When you migrate to a different country
- Forced-When the migrant is forced to leave their source country
- Voluntary-when the migrant chooses to leave their source country
- Permanent-The migrant doesn't intend to leave the host country
- Temporary-The migrant will stay in the host country for a period of time then go back to the source country

What is migration?

Migration is the movement of People moving from one place To another

There are six types of migration:

**National migration**  
This means that the people move somewhere within their country.

**International migration**  
This means that the people move to outside of their country or continent

**Forced migration**  
This is when someone would be forced out of their country because of a crisis, example a famine or a war.

**Permanent migration**  
If you wanted to permanently migrate that would mean that you would have no intention of coming back.

**Temporary migration**  
This is the opposite of permanent migration because it means that if you leave you are only going to stay there for a little while.

**Voluntary migration**  
This is when the person has a choice to migrate- as if they want to.

### Facts:

- 272 million people migrated in 2019
- That is 3.5% of the world population
- The majority of them migrated to Asia or Europe

## ALL ABOUT MIGRANTS

Migration is the movement of people going from one place to another.

- There are six different types of migration. They are:
  - National – moving from a different place within the same country
  - International - moving from one country to another
  - Voluntary - you have a choice to move to a different country
  - Forced - is when you don't have a choice to move to a different country e.g. when there is a war
  - Temporary - when you do intend to return to your home
  - Permanent-when you don't intend on returning to your birth country.
- In 2019 there were 272 million international migrants in the world according to a report. This is only 3.5 percent of the global population.
- Asia and Europe were the 2 continents that took in the most international migrants.

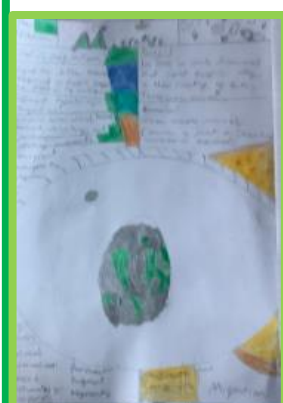
## MIGRATION

Migration is the movement of people to another place. There are many types of migration. These are...

- National migration- A migrant moving but staying in the same country.
- International migration- A migrant moving from one country to another.
- Forced migration- A migrant having no choice but to migrate.
- Voluntary migration- A migrant taking the choice to migrate.
- Permanent migration- A migrant moving and planning to stay at their host country forever.
- Temporary migration- When you migrate to your host country and plan to return to your source country.

An Emigrant is a Migrant who is leaving their source country.  
An immigrant is a migrant arriving at a host country.  
Immigration means the movement of people into a country.

Here are some fun facts!  
Most people stay in the country where they were born in.  
The majority of people do not migrate borders.  
3.5% emigrated in 2019, which is over 250 MILLION!!!
