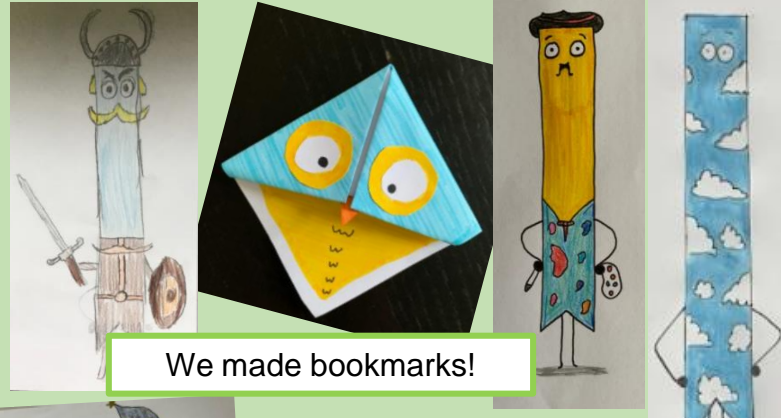

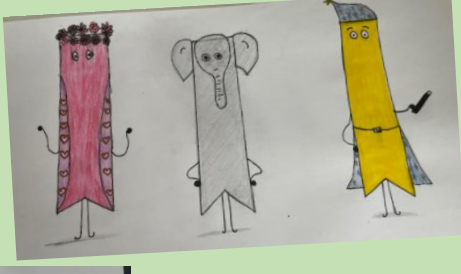
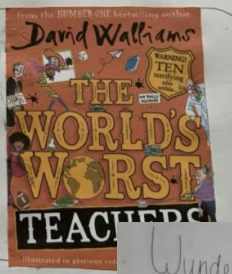
We were inspired by Roald Dahl and created our own nonsense dictionaries.
