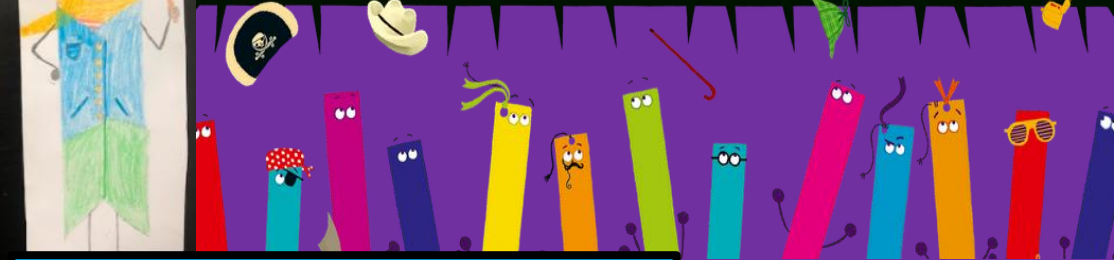

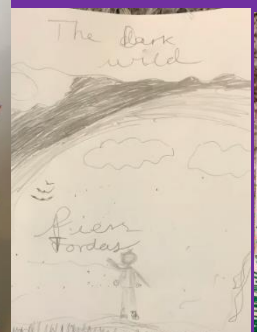
THE HOBBIT

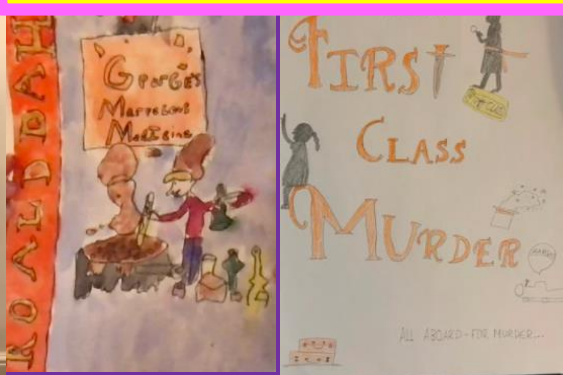
Facts about our favourite authors

About Robin Stevens

Robin Stevens is a crime writer and takes a lot of inspiration from famous authors like Agatha Christie, Ngaio Marsh of Dorothy L.Sayers. She is an American-born English writer and is most famously known for her 'Murder Most Unladylike' series featuring two fifteen-year-old detectives called Daisy and Hazel, nearly absolutely opposite in personality. She has written 9 murder mysteries under the Murder Most Unladylike series and 4 mini mysteries. Below are some rather peculiar facts about my favourite author.

- Robin Stevens has a pet bearded dragon called Watson but she is a girl.
- She really did go to an English boarding school (like Daisy and Hazel), Cheltenham Ladies College. And she really did sleep in a dorm, and learn Latin, and have school on Saturday mornings. She never detected a murder, though, which was a bit of a disappointment to her.
- She has also written the Guggenheim Mystery, a sequel to Siobhan (say Shivon) Dowd's London Eye Mystery.
