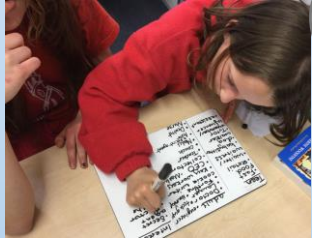


Careers
