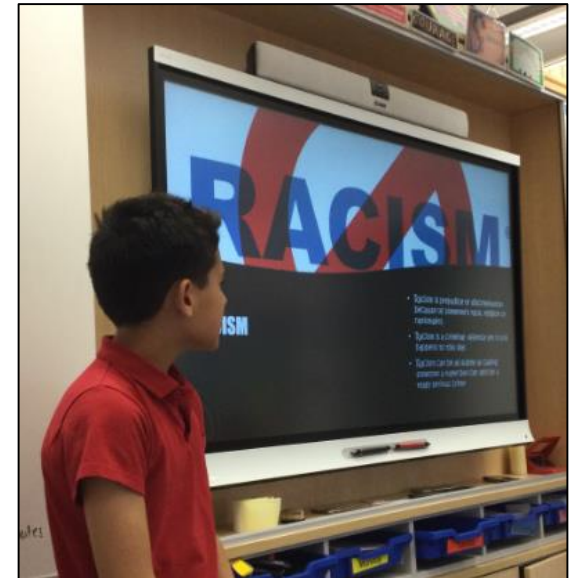
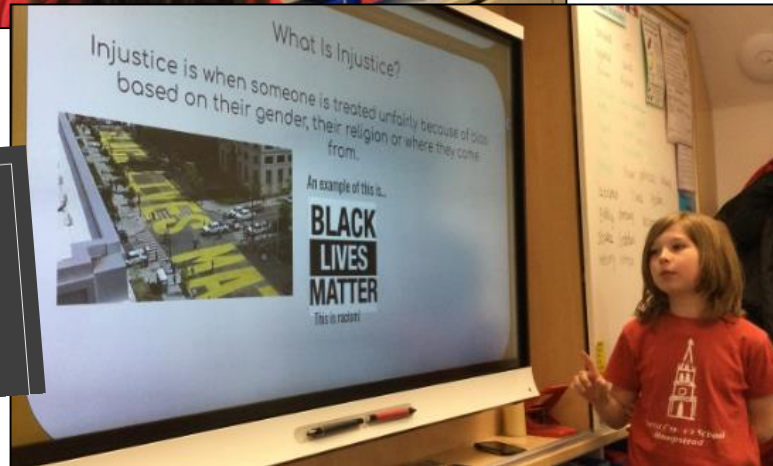
Year 2 presented on topics including children's right to have a pet, gender equality, gymnastics, face mask littering, female representation in government, dolphins and the benefits of art.

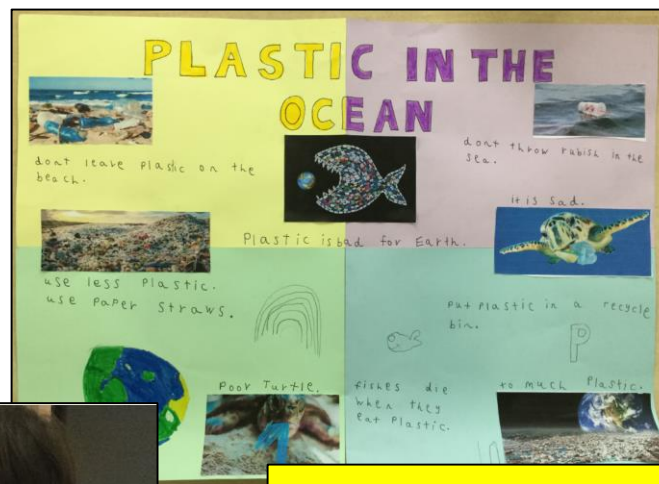


Why we need more Female representation in Government

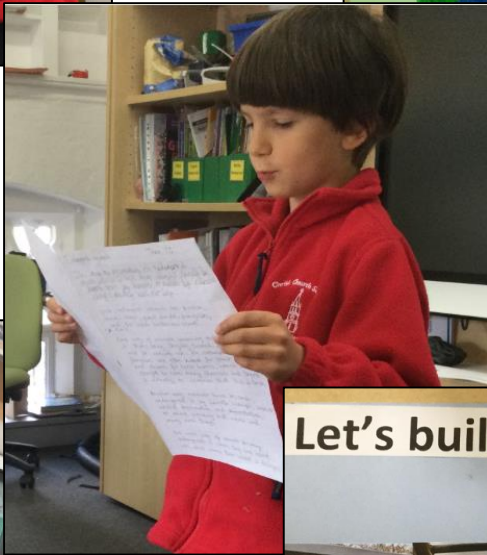

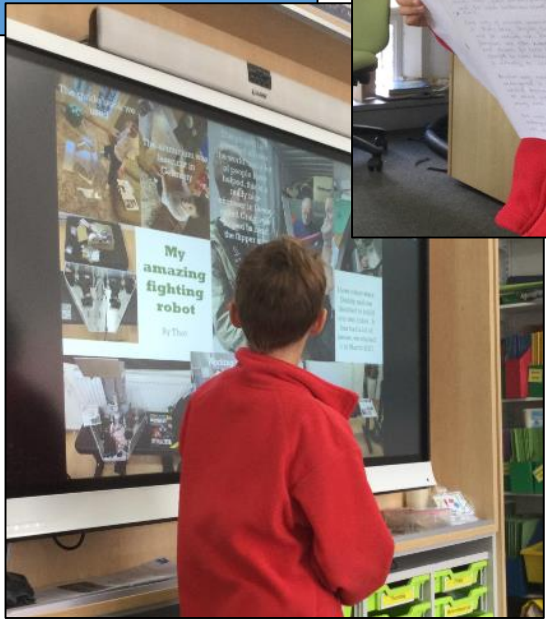




Year 3 presented on topics including their love of embroidery and Tchaikovsky, homelessness, making their own robot, whale hunting, child labour and engineering.
