PSHE week – citizenship and supporting our community

We enjoyed a really interesting PSHE week before half term, focused on becoming good citizens and supporting our wider community. As well as lots of learning about money, careers, charities, rights, democracy and the environment, we all took part in two whole school projects to support our local community: we have created a wonderful video of songs to share with the elderly visitors and residents at Henderson Court and we all made beautiful thank you cards to be given to all the staff at the Royal Free Hospital.



Each class is also planning and putting into action their own project to support a local cause, campaign or charity – please try to get involved if you are asked to support!

The projects taking shape so far include:

- ❖ Reception have been learning about UN Peace Keepers and thinking about how they can support people to be peaceful. They even made their own blue Peace Maker badges!
- ❖ Year 2 have been thinking about food poverty locally. They wrote to our local MP asking her to raise the issue with those in government and they have organised their own class food collection for a local food bank.
- ❖ Year 4 have been inspired by one class member's 'have your say' presentation and have set up their own mini community library box outside school where people can bring and swap books. Please join in with it if you can – the box will be on Christ Church Passage.
- ❖ Year 5 are working on a project to make sure our playtime fruit waste goes into our food waste bins and is collected by the council for composting (just like our lunch time food waste).




Welcomes!
