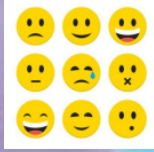
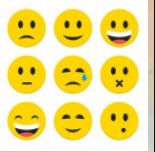




Year 5



In Year 5, our theme was emotions and our art work was inspired by two artists, Frank Bowling and Jim Dine, who both portray different emotions in their own art work. We focused on a piece of artwork called 'Four Hearts' by Jim Dine.

We used Brusho, which is a highly-pigmented watercolour ink, to create our backgrounds. Once we had done this, we painted another sheet of A3 card again using Brusho and then cut out two hearts using a template.



We started by thinking about **how colour can represent different moods and emotions** and decided which colours represented which emotion for us. All of us had different ideas. For example, for some of us, the colour blue represented sadness, but for others it represented feeling calm and relaxed. We created emotion keys in our sketchbooks to showcase how we felt.



Finally, we experimented with chalk rubbing to create the other two heart shapes. We also learnt about **negative space, which is the background or the area that surrounds the subject of the work**. We wanted to showcase our negative space as the background of our artwork portrays our emotions.
