


General Information and Reminders

Homework


Homework will be sent home on *Thursdays* and is due back the following *Tuesday*.

The Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations

We are all looking forward to joining in the celebrations for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee later this term! All classes will be learning about the Queen's life and reign and getting creative by painting portraits and completing our Christ Church Arts Project creating jubilee-themed coasters.

Children will be sharing their learning as part of our **Jubilee Church Service on Friday 27th May at 11am**. All parents and family members are warmly invited to come to the service in Christ Church, to which we have also invited the Mayor of Camden. Children's work will be on display in the Church to look at after the service. We will also be celebrating with a Jubilee Party and Picnic in the Playground!



English



We have begun by looking at the genre, 'Fantasy and Mystery' and are focusing our work around 'The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe'; we will produce lots of creative writing based on this topic and will also be writing persuasive speeches. We will then move on to learn about oral debating. We will also be reading, performing and writing poems with a focus on imagery.

Maths



Topics:	Key Learning:
Perimeter/Area	Perimeter of rectilinear shapes; finding the area of rectangles, compound & irregular shapes.
Decimals	Decimals up to 3 decimal places; adding and subtracting decimals; multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 & 1000.
Percentages	Understanding percentages; percentages as fractions and decimals; equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages.
Shape	Measuring and drawing angles; calculating angles on a straight line, in a triangle and in a quadrilateral.
Measurement	Calculating volume; converting between mm cm m and km; converting between ml, cl, l and kl.

RE



To begin with, we are continuing our work on Sikhism, thinking about what it means to be a Sikh. We will then be thinking about Christianity again and our big question this term is 'How has the Christian message survived for over 2000 years?' We will be learning about how Jesus tasked his disciples with the job of spreading the 'Good News' of Christ before his ascension. We will be thinking about what makes a good 'message' and what might stop the spread of a message. We will also discuss how early Christians were persecuted and consider how persecution affects society today. We will then be exploring our own different ideas about God.

Science



We have just finished our first topic on 'Living Things and their Habitats'. We will now move on to a new topic all about 'Earth and Space', where we will be learning about the planets in our solar system and the movement of these relative to the sun. We will also learn about 'Animals Including Humans', thinking specifically about changes as humans develop to old age. Our other topics will be 'Everyday Materials', where we will learn that some changes result in the formation of new materials; and 'Forces and Magnets' where we will identify the effects of air resistance, water resistance and friction.

Computing



We will be using the program Scratch to develop our knowledge of 'selection' by revisiting how 'conditions' can be used in programming, and then learning how the 'if... then... else...' structure can be used to select different outcomes depending on whether a condition is 'true' or 'false'.

PSHE



This term's PSHE week will focus on the wider community and good citizenship. In Year 5, we will be learning about money, thinking specifically about attitudes towards money and the impact money can have on people. We will also think about rules, laws, democracy and the consequences of not adhering to rules and laws. We will also visit the Houses of Parliament as part of our learning.

PE



In PE lessons this term, the children will be focusing on athletic games which involve throwing and catching, jumping, running and speed. They will work together in small teams to improve, using appropriate techniques.

Music



Following on from their successful performance of Shotgun at the Camden Music Festival, they will continue to develop their instrumental and ensemble skills through learning I've Got A Feeling by The Black Eyed Peas. They will follow a set structure and apply their own composed riffs in the solo sections based upon the G major scale. They will perform this piece at the end of term.

Art



Art will be strongly linked to our Science topics. We will be looking at specific artists including Robert Rauschenberg, exploring different media and combining different print making processes. We will also be working in the negative using rubbers to remove graphite work when drawing the moon.

Design Technology

Our DT project this term will focus on mechanical and electrical systems. We will be making fairground rides, thinking about circuits with motors, pulleys and gears. We will also build on our knowledge of structures.

French

We will be consolidating our learning about how to describe ourselves and others and talk about feelings, including using reflexive verbs. We will move on to giving opinions and preferences about food and drink in spoken and written French.
