
PΕ

Christ Church Arts Project (CAP)

Our Arts Project this term will focus on creating art work inspired by a range of different artists and promoting the UN's sustainable development goals.

We are looking forward to sharing our work with parents and families in an art exhibition in November.

SUSTAINABLE GOALS























English

English will be taught through studying both fiction and non-fiction texts. We will be learning about how to write lists, labels, captions, looking at stories with repeating patterns, and writing our own narratives after looking at traditional tales from other cultures. We will continue with daily phonics lessons and group and individual reading of decodable books.

This term we will focus on sequencing instructions using BeeBots. We will Computing be learning how to log onto a computer and label the different parts of a computer. We will also start to learn about coding using a program called RodoCodo. What responsibility has God given people about taking care of Creation? RE In this unit children will be reminded of the key concept: Creation, Children will understand what it means to be made in God's image. Why are saints important to Christians? During this unit children will apply the idea of being a saint to their own life. Why is each person important in the Nativity story? This unit will remind us of the core concept: Incarnation and help us to know the nativity story and its message. In our History topic we will be learning about toys of the past, present and History future. We will be learning about the toys used in our grandparents' time and how toys have changed over time. We will also be studying the history of the transport of the local area of Hampstead and the wider area. We will be learning to locate the UK on a map and learn the names of the four Geography countries that make it up. The children will be looking at hot and cold areas of the world and where they are on the globe. We will also be learning about daily weather and seasonal change. Our whole school Happiness Project this term will focus on ten themes, PSHE and including goal setting, healthy body, try something new, resilience and Happiness belonging, which can help us all to develop positive strategies to support our Project own and others' mental health. Our PSHE weeks this term will focus on two of the other themes in the Happiness Project: building positive relationships with friends and family and celebrating diversity. Our Year 6 Anti-bullying champions will help to refresh our learning about how to be an upstander, too. This term the children will be learning a number of different skills using various resources including throwing and catching to improve co-ordination and spatial awareness for simple games. Children will also be forming shapes and balances in gymnastics. We will be exploring the foundations of music, pulse and tempo. Music Students will be applying these skills into the Swahili song Che Che Kule from Ghana which they will perform through singing and playing a variety of percussive instruments. Children will be investigating the possibilities of direct and overprinting using Art primary colours. They will also begin to represent texture by using different marks and use collage to create self-portraits. We will be looking at the artists Edward Tingatinga and Eric Carle. Children will be designing and creating a nativity character finger puppet using Design a template and joining materials together. Children will then evaluate their Technology designs and finished products, ready for selling them at the Christmas fair!
