

Christ Church Arts Project (CAP)

Our Arts Project this term will focus on creating art work inspired by a range of different artists and promoting the UN's sustainable development goals. We are looking forward to sharing our work with parents and families in an art

English

English this term will be taught through a range of genres including myths and legends, poetry and recounts. We will be using a range of texts to inspire our writing, including the story of Theseus and the Minotaur. We will also focus on developing our reading skills using VIPERS (vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summarise) through a range of books read in class.

Topics:	Key Learning:
Place Value	Representing, partitioning, comparing and ordering 3 digit numbers.
Addition and Subtraction	Different strategies for adding and subtracting 2 and 3 digit numbers including the column method.
Multiplication and Division	We will be learning the 3, 4 and 8 times tables and exploring the links between them using a range of different strategies for multiplication and division.



We will be using Rodocodo to develop our coding skills in computing. We will also look at e-Safety, how to use the internet to research topics and use our word processing skills to type up some of our writing.

Two Big Questions will be learnt about this term: RE What is the Bible's Big Story? How does the season of Advent and the feast of the Epiphany point towards the true meaning of Christmas? Our class topic for this term is Ancient Egypt. We will be learning about History the uses of the River Nile, gods and goddesses, Tutankhamun and lots more! We will be building upon our skills in history using a range of primary and secondary sources. This will be supported by a visit to the British Museum. In Geography this term, we will be investigating human and physical Geography geography of the South East region of the UK (including London). We will think about topics like cliff erosion and the uses of the River Thames. We will be developing our fieldwork skills through the use of maps, databases and observational sketches. PSHE and Our whole school Happiness Project this term will focus on ten themes, including goal setting, healthy body, try something new, resilience and Happiness belonging, which can help us all to develop positive strategies to support Project our own and others' mental health. Our PSHE weeks this term will focus on two of the other themes in the Happiness Project: building positive relationships with friends and family and celebrating diversity. Our Year 6 Anti-bullying champions will help to refresh our learning about how to be an upstander, too. In PE lessons, we will be practising ball skills in basketball: handling and PF passing, dribbling, shooting and defending. We will also be learning about netball including pivoting and passing as well as game play. As musicians it is vital that we can establish a steady pulse and use that Music as a foundation to play a variety of exciting rhythms to different tempos. This term we will be applying these musical principles into our composed STOMP inspired body percussion pieces. Art this term will be linked to our topic of Ancient Egypt; we will be using Art mono-printing to replicate Egyptian art and creating 3D relief sculptures of Egyptian masks. We will also be using watercolour paints to experiment with colour mixing. This term, design and technology will focus on the use of pneumatics and Design levers to create movement. We will research real world uses of Technology pneumatics and produce 3D Christmas cards with moving parts. Year 3 will be building on last year's introduction to French, by French

beginning to write some of the vocabulary and phrases learnt last year.
