Class assembly


Our class assembly will be on Friday 20th October. In this assembly, we will be sharing our PGL experience.

Christ Church Arts Project (CAP)

Our Arts Project this term will focus on creating art work inspired by a range of different artists and promoting the UN's sustainable development goals. We are looking forward to sharing our work with parents and families in an art exhibition in November.

English will be taught through a range of genres this term, including a variety of fiction, starting with a unit based on the Anthony Horowitz book titled, Stormbreaker. We will explore devices writers use to both entertain and inform the reader. We will write play scripts, letters, character and setting descriptions, a newspaper report and a non-chronological report.
