
PE


The performances will take place on Thursday 21st March (pm) and Friday 22nd March (evening). More information, including about tickets and how you can help, will be shared with parents soon.

The children will revise and consolidate their weekly spellings and will be continuing to develop their cursive handwriting style. Reading will continue to develop children's decoding techniques and will focus more on comprehension of texts.
