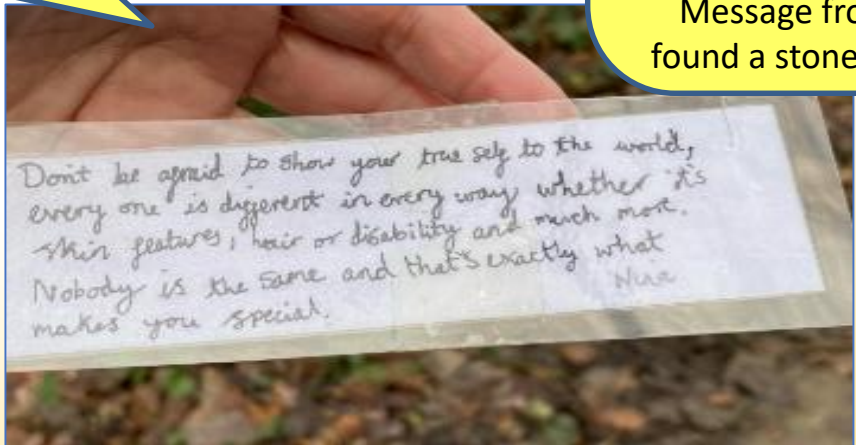


'...We certainly need more happiness and this was a creative way to engage the children. It was appreciated.'

Message from a US tourist who found a stone on Hampstead Heath.

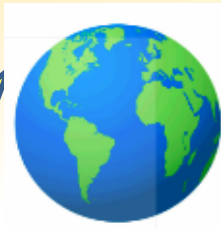

'Thank you for your beautifully-decorated stones and your message. They are spreading smiles and happiness!' Message from a mum and her three-year-old son on the Heath.

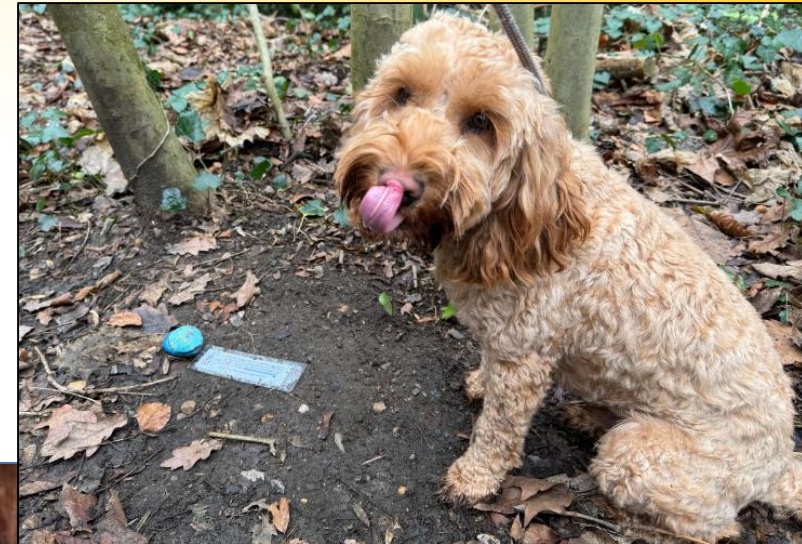
