Over the past month we have all quickly got ourselves back in the busy school routine – it is great to see the after school clubs up and running, our sports teams starting to represent the school and trips out of the classroom starting up. Trips are a very important part of our school life and add a great deal to the teaching in the classroom. 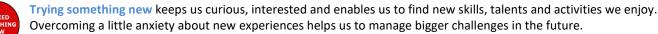
